

Rules and Obligation of joining the Woodlake Antelope Archers

1. Must attend 6 meetings and 5 work parties each year. Each missed meeting adds \$5.00 to your dues and each missed work party adds \$15.00 to your dues. If you attend 6 meetings and 5 work parties your yearly dues are \$30.00, which are due on January 1. If dues are not paid by March meeting, a \$10.00 late fee is added to dues. If dues are not paid by April meeting, you are required to rejoin the club and dues are \$135.00. First year dues are \$135.00. This membership is for you, your spouse and any children who live with you, under the age of 18. If you do not uphold your share of the workload in maintaining the range, your renewal will be brought before the Board of Directors.
2. Anyone wanting to join the club needs to have a club member to sponsor them. If you do not know anyone, come out to the club and meet some of the members and you can usually find someone that is willing to be responsible for you. Application is accepted at meeting, board members will call references and talk to sponsor and Board will make recommendation to membership at next meeting were prospective members will be voted in or rejected. New and returning members who join the club will be placed on Probation for 1 year during which they will not be allowed to sponsor new members.
3. No Broadheads will be shot on the range unless a broadhead shoot is being held.
4. Upon becoming a member, you will be given a combination to the gate. It is up to you, as a member to keep the gate closed and locked and do not give the combination to anyone. The last person out of the property is responsible for making sure the clubhouse doors are closed, the lights are all off in the clubhouse and bathroom and the gate is closed and locked. Do not give the combination to ANYONE.
5. You are allowed to invite guests to shoot the range, **with you present**, twice, then they are asked to join as a member. This is so that prospective members can see if they enjoy the club and want to join. This does not apply to past members.
6. With the exception of Broken Arrow weekend, which is free for club members, you must pay to be plugged into the electric, even if you are not staying in your trailer. Club members are to pay \$1.00 per day and guests are \$2.00 per day. Please make these payments to the club treasurer. If there are not enough outlets for members to plug into, guests will be asked to unplug from the electricity. During Broken Arrow weekend, only club members will be allowed to plug into electricity.
7. As a member in good standing, you are allowed to camp at the archery range any time you want. If you plug into the electric, you are responsible for paying the club treasurer.
8. We have several scheduled work parties. NO ONE is allowed to shoot the range or practice butts during a work party. A Board Member will call an end to the work party and then shooting is allowed. Sign the work party list in the clubhouse or you will not get credit for the work party. It is your responsibility to make sure you sign in.

9. At the monthly meetings, a sign in sheet is located on the table where the officers are sitting. It is your responsibility to sign in to get credit for the meeting. If you do not sign in, you will not get credit for the meeting. A can is also located on the same table. All members are to put in \$.25 when they sign in. At the end of each meeting, a name is drawn from a container that has all the members and spouses names. If the person who's name is drawn is present at the meeting, they win all the money in the container. If the person is not present, the money is carried over until the next meeting.

10. Our big fund raiser is the Broken Arrow Shoot. It is always held the first full weekend in March. All club members are encouraged to work this work party, as it takes lots of help to put on a quality archery shoot. Under no circumstances will any club member be allowed to shoot this shoot. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** You must be out of the club for a period of 1 year to participate in the shoot. Members are also encouraged to donate adult and children's raffle prizes for the shoot.

11. Our club is responsible for parking the cars for the Woodlake Lions Club Rodeo, held on Mothers Day Weekend. We need all the help we can get for this work party. No One is allowed to shoot the hill or practice butts while this work party is going on, even though we are not working on our range.

12. If you would like to be assigned a target to take care of, ask the officers and they will see if anything is available. If you take care of a target, you are responsible for maintaining the area around the target stakes, the target butts and the trails leading to and from the target. It is a privilege to be assigned a target or refreshment stand. If you need to repair anything on or around your target, and you need to purchase supplies, ask a board member to authorize the purchase. The only time a work party can be claimed is when major work is being done on the stand or target. General maintenance and weed eating on your target are not considered work parties.

13. No hunting on the range. Our insurance carrier does not allow it and it is unsafe to shoot anywhere but at a target butt unless shooting the unmarked 3-D range.

14. You will not be receiving phone calls to remind you of meetings and work parties. If the board or the president call a special meeting or work party, the membership will be notified by phone.

15. Please respect our neighbor's property. No hunting or trespassing on their property and please don't speed around their houses.

16. Anything that is on our property stays on our property. If you want to remove something, you have to get prior approval from the Board of Directors. That means **ANYTHING.**

17. The members of this club feel like we are extended family. Treat the property,

clubhouse and other members like you would your family.

18. Please conduct yourself in a manner that is not detrimental to the club. Take pride in our club, we have one of the best Family Orientated clubs around, with lots of club participation and club functions. Enjoy the sport of archery and have fun.
